#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Caviglia moved to approve the minutes of the regular monthly meeting held on April 12, 2016 as submitted. The motion was seconded by Mr. Berkley and adopted on a unanimous voice vote.

# REPORTS OF COMMITTEES, MEMBERS, & ENGINEER

#### **Engineering Committee**

There was no Committee's Report.

## **Executive Director's Report \***

Mr. Lewis offered his report with no additions.

## Superintendent's Report \*

Mr. Johnson offered his report with the following addition:

# • Wampum Park Pumping Station

Mr. Johnson reported that the display function of the MagFlo meter at the Wampum Park Pump Station is no longer working. To purchase a new meter will cost at least \$9,040.00. He indicated that it is good to have a new meter, but it is not critical since the Authority has a portable meter that can perform a spot check if necessary. The Board discussed the issue and decided to use the existing portable flow meter to record the flow at any pump stations.

## **Engineer's Report \***

Mr. McKelvey presented his report with the following additions:

## • Year 2 Capital Improvement Program

Aqua Infrastructure came across a couple of defects where T&M had recommended one type of repair, but Aqua Infrastructure was recommending a different repair. After re-examining it, Mr. McKelvey agreed with Aqua's plan to do the repair. It will change the contract, and the cost will be slightly greater than the originally proposed amount, but there are sufficient funds in the contract to cover the increase.

#### Pump Station Electrical Service and Equipment Survey

Mr. Charlie Hopkins, an electrical engineer of T&M, and Mr. Johnson performed a survey of electrical services and equipment at all the stations. They discovered that several stations don't have Transient Voltage Surge Suppression (TVSS) equipment, and some other stations don't have full phase protection; they only have phase protection related to Automatic Transfer Switches (ATS). Several stations have the open delta service similar to the service at the Old Deal Road Pump Station. Eatoncrest Pump Station is the only station with power problems at this time. Mr. McKelvey recommended the Board consider a similar upgrade service approved for the Old Deal Road Pump Station for the Eatoncrest Pump Station. Mr. Lewis suggested that Mr. Caviglia, Mr. Johnson, and he should have a meeting with the authority engineers to review the report and discuss the urgent repairs. As per the Board's request, Mr. McKelvey will provide an estimated cost of the repairs.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

#### Additional Space Issue

Mr. Lewis reported that Councilwoman East contacted him on May 4<sup>th</sup> and told him the Borough Council Committee had a meeting to discuss the space issue, and the borough architect is working on revisions for the old Court Clerk area to create space for the Authority.

#### New Truck #31

Mr. Johnson reported that he contacted Mr. Michael Drahuschak of Winner Ford regarding the new truck status. Currently, Mr. Drahuschak has not yet received a production date, and he will let Mr. Johnson know if he has any updates on the new truck.

#### Old Deal Road Pump Station Quotes for Electrical Work

Mr. McKelvey prepared specifications for recommended control panel and control equipment improvements, and he requested quotes from four contractors. The Authority received two quotes for this work on May 6, 2016, but the other two bidders declined to bid.

The lowest bidder is Electro Maintenance Inc. for the total amount of \$23,075.00. T&M has worked with Electro Maintenance, Inc. on similar projects, and their performance has been satisfactory. Mr. McKelvey required Electro Maintenance Inc. to provide a warrantee on the work they have performed. Based on the review of bid documents and past experience, Mr. McKelvey recommended the contract for Old Deal Road Pump Station Controls improvements be awarded to Electro Maintenance, Inc. Mr. McKelvey believes that the pump station should operate well after JCP&L upgrades the service and Electro Maintenance completes the work on the control panel and equipment improvements.

Mr. Caviglia offered a Resolution to award the contract to Electro Maintenance for the total amount of \$23,075.00 based upon the submission of the quotes to the Authority Engineer under the Resolution declaring an emergency to provide for the electrical work at Old Deal Road Pump Station. The Resolution was seconded by Mr. Redd and adopted on the following roll call vote:
